Job Summary

Reporting to the Team Supervisor, the Education Liaison Officer functions as a member of a multi-disciplinary team to establish Educational Transition Wellness Plans to mobilize and coordinate educational supports, resources and culturally responsive system navigation for eligible children and youth in care. The position has a primary role in outreach activities to strengthen agency relationships with school boards, First Nations school authorities, and community partners in order to map available resources and improve educational support and outcomes. The position ensures all activities are aligned with Agency's strategic planning, policies, and procedures and are executed within the legal framework of the Child Youth and Family Services Act and First Nation standards of practice.

- Five (5) years working in education delivery and administration
- Three (3) years' direct experience working with children and families
- Experience working with Aboriginal people, organizations and communities
